Entries: We ask that Schools please complete entries as soon as possible via the shared spreadsheet. As a

courtesy school entries are to be completed the day after your respective Livestock Day. The last

day for entries is Thursday, October 24th by 3pm.

No late entries will be accepted. Note Beginner Leading for calves as below.

Cost: \$5 per child entry fee to be collected by individual schools.

No cash on the day please. Just a reminder that when entering please ensure the child's age is as at the date of Group Day

Parking: Entry to the grounds is at the end of ANZAC Ave off Cureton Street.

Keep speed to **10kms inside the ground** at all times for safety reasons.

Main parking area for vehicles with trailers is through internal gate, then to the left of the drive under the tree line past

food vans. See map.

Cars only and spectator parking in and around A&P Building on both sides of drive.

Registration: Starts from 9.00am with programme and entry numbers to be collected from registration caravan.

Entrants should be all registered by 9.45am.

First Event: **9:45am** - with Beginners Leading **10:00am** - all main events commence

Beginner Leading: Are for **5 and 6 years olds only** entering a calf for the first time and is to help them settle their nerves.

Beginner Leaders will also be entered in the main leading programme.

Catering: There will be food available to purchase throughout the day with a Coffee Cart on site as organised by

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Teams of Three: Held at the conclusion of Dairy Type for calves and MOP/Leading for Lambs and Kids.

Individual Schools Teams may enter teams of three (not mixed school teams) with a maximum of 3 teams per section.

Sections being: Calves - Lambs - Kids - Mixed (any mix of 3 animals)

Judges are looking for leading technique, uniformity, pace etc.

Children's Judging: This will take place during the lunch break.

Children judge as individuals and will find the judging sheet in the programme.

They will judge 3 calves looking for the best head, body, etc. The head judge will then compare notes to determine a

winner for the Silver Fern Farms trophy.

Rearing: Will commence after the lunch break. Lambs and Goats may have completed this section prior to lunch and will end

their day early.

Reminder of the Rules:

For lambs and goats there is no choker/chain collars used. (Stewards can refuse entry into the ring)

No sharing of any animals amongst siblings or friends


Calves must have a NAIT tag
